Dr. Tam is the Chief of the Division of Urology and Director of Robotic Surgery Programme at Queen Mary Hospital. He is also the Honorary Clinical Associate Professor of Department of Surgery at The University of Hong Kong.

Dr. Tam was elected Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh in 1988 and the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons in 1990. Dr. Tam subsequently obtained the Intercollegiate Urology Fellowship in 1991 after one year of higher urology training in England under the Commonwealth Medical Fellowship Award Scheme. Dr. Tam is also a Foundation Fellow of both the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine and the College of Surgeons of Hong Kong (CSHK). Currently, he is Vice-President of the College of Surgeons of Hong Kong and Chairman of the Urology Board of CSHK.

Dr. Tam has focused his clinical and research interest on the treatment of prostate cancer, male sexual dysfunction and infertility. He has also participated in many clinical trials on agents used in treatment of prostate cancer, erectile dysfunction, BPH and overactive bladder.
